Bias-Related Incidents 	<p>The goal of Emory University Bias Support Services (BSS) is to uphold our vision of inclusivity and fairness. The primary mission is to confront biases and transform them into catalysts for personal and collective growth and understanding.</p> <p>If you have experienced or been witness to a bias incident, we encourage you to submit the Emory University Bias Reporting Form for support and review through BSS.</p>
Counseling and Psychological Services (CAPS) 	<p>Confidential short-term individual therapy, couples therapy, group therapy, community referrals, and workshops are available through Counseling and Psychological Services to help you better manage anxiety and support your mental health. Schedule an appointment here.</p> <p>Crisis counselors are available to meet in-person from Monday - Friday, 8:30AM - 5:00PM. CAPS has expanded after-hours support to include provide students with support. Students can reach a counselor by calling 404-727-7450 24 hours a day, 7 days a week.</p>
Conflict Resources 	<p>The Ombuds Office operates independently and impartially to help you explore solutions to your concerns without judgment. We are here to help you tackle challenges discreetly and efficiently, with a commitment to confidentiality, independence, and impartiality. Click or scan the QR code for conflict resources.</p>

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Case Managers Available 	<p>Student Case Management and Intervention Services operates within a nurturing non-clinical environment to educate students, staff, and faculty on how to effectively navigate on-campus and community services in key areas of insecurity, such as food and housing, and guides students to access holistic well-being and academic resources.</p>
Student Intervention Services	<p>Complete the Student of Concern Form to connect with a Case Manager for personalized support or contact Student Intervention Services (SIS) for crisis triage surrounding acute basic needs. SIS is available 24/7, 404-430-1120.</p>
Financial Support 	<p>If you are experiencing financial difficulties related to personal expenses or tuition, please contact the RSPH Student Support Team at rollinsstudentsupport@emory.edu.</p>
Food & Housing Security 	<p>If you are experiencing food insecurity, please fill out the Food Security Safeguard Program Form. This will enable you to receive three meal swipes for the Dobbs Common Table for immediate use. If you request additional swipes, a case manager to reach out to you directly to discuss on and off campus food resources.</p> <p>You can also complete the Student of Concern Form to connect with a Case Manager if you are experiencing food or housing insecurity.</p>
